













BUT AWARENESS OF E-CIGARETTES IS HIGHER - HALF OF SMOKERS KNOW ABOUT THEM






MORE THAN A THIRD OF SMOKERS ARE FAMILIAR WITH E-CIGARETTES








THREE-QUARTERS OF SMOKERS ARE UNSURE OF THE LEGAL STATUS OF E-CIGARETTES



Through tax and regulatory policies, the Government should encourage adult smokers to switch to less harmful alternatives to cigarettes and ensure they are not used by youth.


